SUBJECT: FIRE INSPECTOR FOR DENVER INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

The Fire Prevention Division is anticipating an opening for a Technician position in the near future. The Facilities Inspector position at Denver International Airport (DEN) will be effective January 1, 2017. This position will be based in the Airport Division administrative offices at new Fire Station 35 and reports directly to Fire Prevention.

This assignment in Fire Prevention is both rewarding and challenging. The position requires an individual with good organizational and communication skills. The workload is challenging and requires a dedication to the assignment. All Fire Prevention functional units work closely together to gain compliance with very difficult, complex issues; a spirit of cooperation and teamwork is critically important. A Fire Prevention assignment provides members with the opportunity to enhance skill sets which can be extremely valuable for advancing your career as well as enabling you to function more effectively at your current and future ranks.

Duties and responsibilities of this position include but are not limited to:

- Perform inspections of all structures inside and outside of sterile area
- Respond to referrals involving structures both within and outside of sterile area
- Assist Airport Fueling Inspector with inspections/certification of aircraft fueling vehicles.
- Assist DFD Airport Division personnel with issues arising during assigned inspections
- Assist Fire Prevention personnel with systems acceptance testing of DEN systems.
- Assist Fire Prevention personnel with issuance of operational permits and related inspections

Fire Prevention personnel work within a 40-hour work week environment. Within that 40-hour/week framework, members are allowed flexibility in hours worked per day, and in vacation scheduling and usage.
